Deaths

Calvin Eugene Milan, 77, died Feb. 3 at his home in Litchfield, MN. A memorial service was conducted at the Litchfield Christian Church Feb. 6. He was born Jan. 2, 1926, in Kimball, MN, to Joseph William and Emma Ann Milan. He attended the Kimball Church of Christ, where he was immersed at age 8. He served in the Army Air Corps during World War II, where he trained to be a tail gunner and later a mechanic on B-17 bombers. After an honorable discharge in 1946, he entered Minnesota Bible College, where he earned his four-year degree in ministry. On June 26, 1950, he

married Vila Jean Hilary. The couple served with churches in Chippewa Falls, WI; Clarion, IA (18 years); O'Neill, NE; and Litchfield, MN (17 years). He retired in 1991, and then worked for the Litchfield Public Library as part of the "Green Thumb" program. Mr. Milan had many interests—he built model airplanes, whittled animal statuettes, drew and painted (with water colors being a favorite medium), built telescopes, performed magic tricks, built a baritone ukulele, sang in a male quartet, loved dogs, and enjoyed books on the Civil War and Bible history. Mr. Milan was preceded in death by his parents; one brother, Leslie; and one infant grandson, Nathaniel Pease. He is survived by his widow, Vila; one daughter, Jan Pease of Litchfield; one son, Jim of Rochester, MN; and one granddaughter. Mr. Milan was cremated and the family is planning a spring inurnment at the Maine Prairie Cemetery north of Kimball. Memorials may be made to the Litchfield Christian Church or Crossroads College in Rochester, MN.

Dr. Douglas Ernest Henry died Jan. 20. He was a second-generation Christian who graduated from the Vellore (India) Medical College, then received further training in England and served with the Leprosy Mission as a plastic surgeon for 34 years in India. He was born on July 5, 1929, in Central India; he was married to the late Usha Chatterji. He was a member of the Church of Christ in Bilaspur, India. He received the Paul Harrison Award from the Vellore Medical College in 1996 for the longest service in a rural Christian hospital. When he started his work, the rate of leprosy was 20 in 1,000; by his retirement, it was totally controlled in that area. He is survived by three daughters, Dr. Shashi Jacob, Dr. Sheela Lal, and Dr. Indu Lal; and one son, Dr. David Henry. The funeral on Jan. 21 was attended by more than 1,500 people. Dr. Ajai Lal preached the funeral message. Dr. Henry will be remembered as a godly father, dedicated medical surgeon, and a faithful Christian leader.

At 6:30 A.M. Jan. 13, a **fire ravaged Far East Broadcasting Company's WIND-FM station in Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia**, destroying 40 percent of the building with damages amounting to approximately \$120,000. Fortunately, no staff members were in the building at that time. The cause of the fire is unknown, but it apparently started on the same floor as their only on-air studio. "The fire had claimed our newly built on-air studio along with the third floor," said Batjargal Tuvshintengel, director of FEBC Mongolia. "The rest of the equipment had been salvaged, but the building suffers water

damage and frost (temperature outside at that time was 16 below zero)." The station was able to resume broadcasts the next day using only a Sony Discman. The WIND-FM staff worked tirelessly in freezing temperatures to transfer equipment and archives that survived the fire. Eagle TV, a local Christian TV station in Ulaanbaatar, has provided accommodations for WIND-FM staff to continue broadcasting.
