- balanced commitment to the Church, to Christian higher education, and to the broader academy

Applicants who have applied theology in a ministry setting will be preferred. Given the nature of the Churches or Churches of Christ. Applicants should be prepared to respond to the University's mission, statement of faith, core values, and philosophy of education (which are available at www.lincolnchristian.edu/about-us/).
